to our waterways

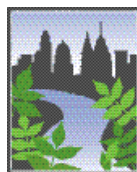
Runoff is rain water that “runs off” across land instead of seeping into the ground. Many **storm drains** empty directly into streams. Runoff collects pollutants such as leaky motor oil, pet waste and litter from our streets, sidewalks and yards and washes it into storm drains.

What you can do to curb runoff:

- Bag or compost leaves.
- Put dog waste in the toilet or trash can, not in street or storm drain. Dog waste carries DISEASE-CAUSING BACTERIA into our water supply.
- Put trash in trash cans and clean up litter so it doesn't end up into storm drains and end up in our streams and rivers.
